Obesity is more than a cosmetic problem; it is a health hazard. Several serious medical conditions have been linked to obesity, including type 2 diabetes, heart disease, high blood pressure and stroke. Obesity is also linked to higher rates of certain types of cancer. Other diseases and health problems linked to obesity include gall bladder disease and gallstones, liver disease, osteoarthritis which lead to deterioration of joints, gout which also affects the joints and reproductive problems in women. Studying a large, diverse group of children in the U.S., researchers found that rapid weight gain during the first four months of life was associated with an increased risk of being overweight at age

seven, regardless of birth weight and weight at one year.

As the trend is to equate attractiveness with slimness, especially for women, obesity make people feel unattractive. This method of treatment depends on the level of obesity, overall health condition and motivation to lose weight. Treatment may include a combination of diet, exercise, behaviour modification and sometimes weight-loss drugs. The benefits of exercise are much more than any other way of losing weight. Not only does exercise help you lose weight but it also improves your fitness and flexibility and improves skin texture. Exercise is also free from harmful side effects of crash dieting, slimming capsules and the heat treatment used by slimming centers.


